The past couple of months have seen us work closely with partner organisations and volunteer representatives to hold two pretty major events, and we're pleased to report that everything went super smoothly and the feedback from attendees has been fantastic!

Our first big event was the launch of our brand new **West Glamorgan People's Forum** on the 18th of April. Over 200 people joined us at Swansea.com stadium for a jampacked programme of performances, workshops, presentations and information stalls.

This was our first event of this scale since 2019, and it was clear from the buzz in the room just how much we all value the opportunity to come together.

AIMS OF THE DAY

The event was 'multi-purpose' in that we wanted to highlight and celebrate some of the amazing work being undertaken by organisations within our region, while also focusing on the future and considering how we will expand our network of voices.

The event's varied agenda made for an entertaining and informative day, with contributions from Unpaid Carers, our regional co-production group and Llais (Neath Port Talbot and Swansea region) to name but a few.

The morning session saw the official launch of the **Regional Carers Strategy**, which featured a presentation from some of the Carers involved in the development of the new Strategy, as well as a digital story outlining the challenges Carers face and their hopes for the future.

WORKSHOPS AND PERFORMANCES

One of our main objectives when planning the event was to ensure participants had the chance to share their views and experiences on the health and social care-related issues that mattered to them via our workshop sessions.

These focused on topics such as dementia, accommodation solutions, and mental health (which included a guest appearance from Swansea Council's therapy dogs - a huge hit with the crowd!).

Other highlights included the wonderfully uplifting performances from the Musical Memories choir (pictured) which supports people living with dementia, and the African Community Centre's fantastic drumming group.

Both initiatives receive Regional Integration Funding (RIF) via West Glamorgan and are making a significant and meaningful difference to the lives of the people receiving their services.

Emma Woollett, Chair of the West Glamorgan Regional Partnership Board praised the efforts of everyone involved, saying:

"The event gave us an opportunity to check in with each other and to hear all about the great work being carried out by different partners across West Glamorgan.

It also gave us a solid starting point for our new People's Forum, and the feedback from attendees will help shape our approach to continuous engagement to ensure that citizens and carer volunteers are given every opportunity to contribute at all levels of the Regional Partnership.

'Ageing Well' was established in 2021 by the Council's Partnership and Involvement team to support residents aged 50 and over "to be healthy, to be safe inside and outside the home, to enjoy life, to have a voice and make a positive contribution to help improve Swansea".

MAY YOUR VOICE BE WITH YOU

May the fourth saw the second of our big events of the season as we headed back to Swansea.com stadium for 'May Your Voice Be With You'.

This was a collaborative initiative led by West Glamorgan alongside the **Swans Foundation** and **Interplay**. Its aims were to launch the new **Learning Disability Liaison Forum** and provide an opportunity for attendees to support the development of the **Regional Learning Disability Strategy** by participating in workshops focused on the health and social care issues that matter to them.



The day kicked off with an opening speech by West Glamorgan Programme Director **Kelly Gillings** after everyone had a chance to grab a coffee and browse around the range of colourful information stalls.

Swansea Council's Head of Adult Services, **Amy Hawkins** then delivered a presentation on the vision for the West Glamorgan Learning Disability Board and the Regional Learning Disability Strategy.

Lloyd Thomas, Learning Disability Manager at the Swans Foundation followed Amy with a presentation on the brand new Learning Disability Liaison Forum. This exciting venture will give people with a Learning Disability a chance to have their



say on how health and social care services should be delivered within our region.

Attendees were also treated to a screening of video case studies produced by our communications team in West Glamorgan which demonstrate the brilliant work of three organisations Interplay, BAME Mental Health Support, and Awel Aman Tawe/Taith Co-op (these are now available to view on our Vimeo page - https://vimeo.com/showcase/10491258).

Two workshop sessions followed, which gave everyone a chance to share their views on a series of key themes identified by people with a Learning Disability in the early stages of the Strategy's development.

HOME FIRST SUCCESS

The West Glamorgan **Home First** service was established in 2021 with the aim of reducing delays in hospital discharges, as well as helping to prevent unnecessary admissions.

When someone is discharged from hospital, they tend to recover more quickly when they are in familiar surroundings. Home First brings together a range of health and social care professionals who work with individuals to determine their care and support needs and tailor their services accordingly.

Partners have been working tirelessly behind the scenes to streamline the processes associated with hospital discharges, and early May saw the launch of a new and improved series of discharge pathways.

Colleagues in digital services have also updated the systems used to facilitate discharges, which allows for fast and seamless communication between staff and organisations.




DISCHARGE SUPPORT

Last month also saw the launch of **Discharge Support** - a new directory style web page designed to provide hospital staff coordinating discharges with all the information they need about support services and other helpful resources available to ensure hospital leavers have the best experience possible.

Colleagues involved in its development visited wards to promote the new initiative (pictured above).

It has been a period of significant change and there is still more to be done to ensure new ways of working are implemented to best effect, but everyone's efforts have been phenomenal and we'll update you on the progress of Home First in a future edition of our newsletter.
